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Nadler's Poll Losses Indicate Levin's Gain

SA Public Affairs conducted a poll of likely voters in New York's tenth congressional district by targeting people who have voted in a recent general election AND indicated they plan to vote in November.

The results demonstrate – in no uncertain terms – that Congressman Jerry Nadler is not popular among his constituents and will face a tough reelection campaign this fall.

A majority of voters said it's time to elect someone new, rather than reelect Nadler. Naomi Levin - the daughter of refugees, a successful a computer engineer and activist - is *perfectly* positioned to capitalize on Nadler's weaknesses.

Mayor Bill de Blasio will continue to be an albatross on Democratic candidates throughout New York. Only 29% of voters approve of Mayor de Blasio's job performance while *nearly 47% of voters disapprove*. Furthermore, **only 16% of voters support Mayor de Blasio's plan to replace the Specialized High Schools Admissions Test**, while nearly 48% disapprove.

Congressman Nadler's abject failure to bring federal transportation money to the city will also be a **severe** weakness for him heading into November. *Only 11% of voters think their local elected officials have done their part to address the MTA transit crises*. 64% of voters believe they have not done their part.

New York State is the home to almost 40% of all U.S. transit riders, but receives only 15% of federal Highway Trust Funds. *Nadler's failure is obvious*.

By committing to work in a bipartisan fashion to bring federal aid to the MTA, Naomi Levin can capitalize on Nadler's greatest failure.

A plurality of voters support an education tax credit for private and parochial schools. This is yet *another* area where Congressman Nadler has no record of action or achievement. Again, Naomi Levin can provide bipartisan leadership where Congressman Nadler failed.

Congressman Jerry Nadler faces a surprisingly difficult reelection campaign this year against Naomi Levin. **He has simply not delivered on the issues most important to his constituents**, and the district is amendable to a moderate and progressive Republican like Naomi Levin.
